TEACHER'S DAY CELEBRATION




GRADUATION DAY








SPORTS INAUGURATION - MERAKI '24



MINI MUN: THE AIDS EPIDEMIC, FREEZE DATE:1998

The Mini MUN on the AIDS epidemic, freeze date 1998, was held on October 26, 2024, at Lecture Hall 2, SRIHER Main Block. Model United Nations (MUN) simulates a UN conference where students act as delegates to tackle global issues. This event featured 20 participants in the WHO committee, aiming to address the AIDS crisis.

The day began with a briefing on MUN procedures, easing beginners into the rules. Morning discussions centered on breaking social stigmas, media's role, and AIDS testing and prevention. The session intensified in the afternoon with a crisis scenario, challenging delegates to stay calm and avoid conflict escalation. The committee passed a resolution unanimously and concluded with a feedback session from the chairs.






VOICES -10

DIWALI FIRST AID AWARENESS TALK AND ACT








The Theatre Club led a brief interactive awareness session and engaged the children with tips on first aid and how to enjoy a safer, greener Diwali.








INDEPENDENCE DAY BLOOD DONATION DRIVE








DIYA OF HOPE -DIWALI PLAY DATE EVENT








'MY NATION - MY PRIDE' QUIZ








PERFORMANCE AT THE PAEDIATRIC **CONFERENCE**






INSTALLATION CEREMONY OF STUDENT BOARD - 2024-2025










KICK-OFF MEETING


