








UNIVERSITY AUDITIONS




BLOOD DONATION DRIVE








WEEKEND QUIZ MASTERS - TIME ATTACK

WEEKEND QUIZ MASTERS – COMMUNICATION SHOWDOWN











WEEKEND QUIZ MASTERS - WINGS OF FIRE




INTERNATIONAL MEN'S DAY CELEBRATION


"CHASE" – GROUP ROTARACT MEET








SRIHER GRAMUTSAV - RANGOLI COMPETITION















QUEST FOR HOPE: ONLINE UNDERGRADUATE QUIZ








CATALYST 2025: IGNITING YOUTH, SHAPING TOMORROW
