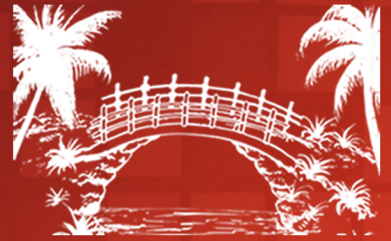

The ARQ 1st International Conference on Accreditation, Ranking, and Quality was held from 19th to 21st June bringing together 840 participants from academia, industry, and policymaking sectors. The conference served as a premier platform for discussing advancements, challenges, and best practices in accreditation, institutional rankings, and quality assurance in higher education. Focus areas included accreditation frameworks (NAAC, NABH, UGC, ISO), Global ranking systems (QS, THE, NIRF), Best practices in institutional quality assurance and Digital transformation in higher education. 35 speakers and moderators participated from various institute like National University of Singapore; Newcastle University, Malaysia; Monash University, Malaysia; University of Colombo, Sri Lanka; CENMED, United Kingdom; American Association of Medical Education, USA. 114 institutes benefitted from the conference. The conference recorded 900 registrations.
